GUYANA

Guyana is a small, English speaking South American country situated on the north of the continent. 80% of the land surface is covered in pristine tropical rainforest, with other regions of coast, mountains and savannah—

the narrow coastal strip accounts for only 4% of the land surface but is home to 90% of the population.



Guyana's population is as diverse as its geography, though it remains the home of the native Amerindian people. Due to its tumultuous history of colonisation, it is also home to people of African, Portuguese and Chinese descent, amongst others.

This small country boasts a stunning variety of flora and fauna. Jaguars, giant otters, capybaras and harpy eagles can all be spotted here, as well as numerous species of frog, such as the dyeing dart frog, below.


